At St Cecilia's our vision is to be a school community where we celebrate everyone's gifts, and where everyone has a chance to flourish and grow together.














Behaviour


We focus on positive behaviour and promote kindness at all times

Attendance

- We understand that attendance at nursery is not statutory. However, as a school we take attendance seriously and expect parents to notify us of any planned or unplanned absences.
- When a child is absent from school due to sickness, we expect that the school is informed before 9.15am via the school office.
- This allows us to be sure that we know where all the children are and do not need to spend time trying to contact parents/carers.
- The Government continue to place high priority on attendance.
- Persistent absence may result in the funded nursery places being withdrawn.

Lunches and Snack time

Snack time

Children are encouraged to have a mid-morning and mid-afternoon snack. We provide a selection of fresh fruits and vegetables and a drink of milk.

You may pack your child a snack from home but these must be a healthy snack. Below are list of options for a healthy snack:

- Bread sticks /pitta
- Cereal bar (no nuts)



<u>Literacy</u>

- As a school we follow Read Write Inc to teach children the skills needed to decode words and read. We start this in Spring / Summer term by teaching daily phonics.
- We use a language screener called Language Link on all children in Reception. This enables us to identify and address any issues with a child's speech and language development.
- Children in Nursery will bring home a picture book that they have selected from our school library. This is for you to enjoy together at home. Please return these in your child's book bag so that they can swap it for another.



Maths

We follow the White Rose Maths framework and the Maths Mastery approach. This begins in nursery with learning colours, matching, sorting, number, pattern, positional language and shape.

You can help at home by:

- counting songs and games
- noticing numerals, shapes and colours in the environment
- Can children collect red/blue/yellow/square/circle items from around the house.
- Hide and seek: Hide an object/toy that is red/blue/yellow. Children to find it. Once they find it, they need to say, 'I found the red/blue/yellow toy!'
- Chop some fruit and discuss healthy eating and the colour of the fruit. Red apples, strawberries, tomatoes.
- Play eye spy using the colours or shapes e.g. 'I spy with my little eye, something coloured red'. This can be played indoors and outdoors/ in the supermarket/ in the car etc.

Home Learning

We would like you to read with your child and develop and love of literature through exposure.

Being ready to learn!

Children benefit from:

- A good night's sleep (including an early enough bedtime)
- A healthy diet including a good breakfast
- Being clean and comfortable
- Being in school on time


