At St Cecilia's our vision is to be a school community where we celebrate everyone's gifts, and where everyone has a chance to flourish and grow together.





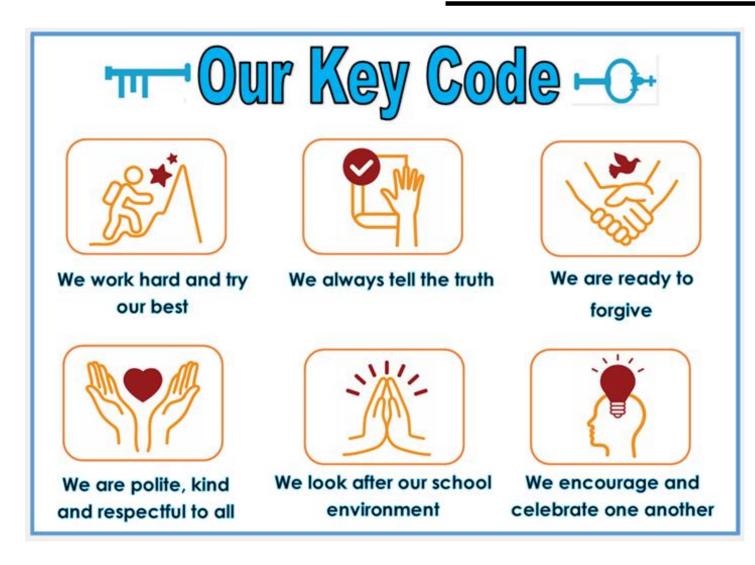








Behaviour

They are linked to our school values

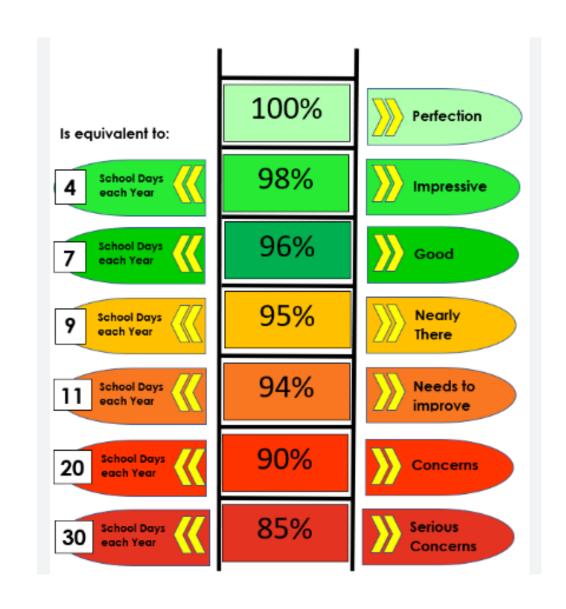
We focus on positive behaviour and promote kindness at all times

If needed children complete reflection time sheets if behaviour becomes persistent

Attendance

- The Government continue to place high priority on attendance.
- When a child is absent from school due to sickness,
 we expect that the school is informed before
 9.15am via the school office.
- This allows us to be sure that we know where all the children are and do not need to spend time trying to contact parents/carers.
- If attendance drop below 95%, or we identify a pattern in absences, you will be contacted to discuss this.
- If attendance becomes an issue we will work collaboratively with you to improve it.
- As a school we can request medical evidence of illnesses if attendance drops too low.
- Lateness also contributes to lost learning e.g. if your child is late 5 minutes each day they lose 3 days!



<u>Attendance</u>

Term time Holiday

- Any request for term time off must be made in writing to the Head of School
- Only exceptional circumstances are considered e.g Funerals, Weddings, where dates are out of the family's control
- We can ask for evidence of the exceptional circumstance
- The biggest question we ask is, "Could the time off be avoided?"
- Term time holiday will be marked as unauthorised
- If we suspect that a child has been on holiday and the school has not been notified, we will ask for medical evidence of illness as a child who is off for 4/5 days should be visiting a doctor

Regular term time absence can lead to fixed penalty notices and in extreme cases criminal proceedings. Please see out attendance information on our website.

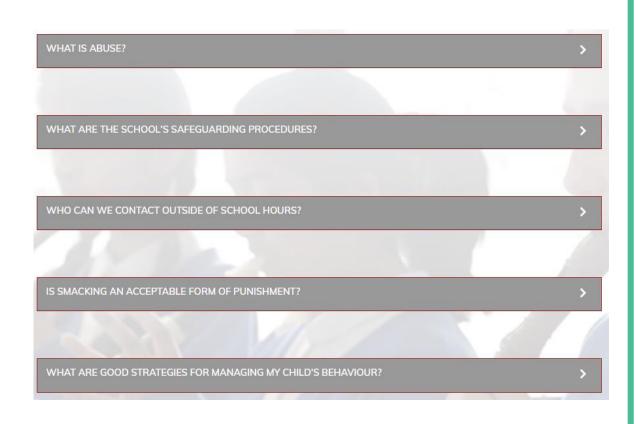

School Lunches and Breaktime snacks

Children are encouraged to have a break time snack but this snack must be a healthy snack. Below are list of options for a healthy snack:

- A portion of fruit or vegetables
- Bread sticks/ pitta
- Portion of cheese
- Pretzels
- Malt bread

The following are not allowed in school as snacks:

- Crisps
- Chocolate
- Biscuits

These will be confiscated and returned to the children at the end of the day.

Lunches

Option 1 - Packed lunch: Should include a savoury item e.g sandwich, pitta, wrap. Piece of fruit, biscuit/ crisps and one 'desert'. This should not be a chocolate bar or sweets.

Option 2 - Order a lunch: This can be ordered online in the morning via Arbor. The menu is on the school website.

Children are expected to wear the following items on a day to day basis:



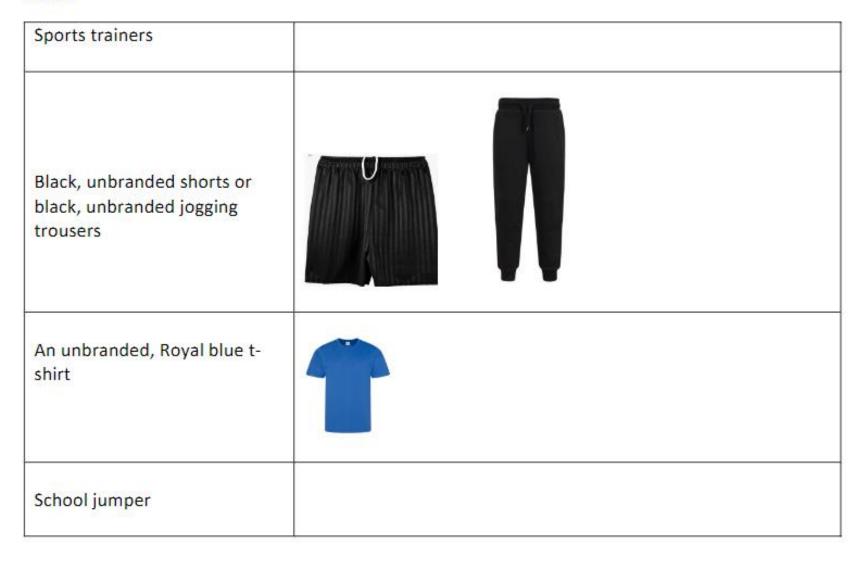

Your child's PE days are:

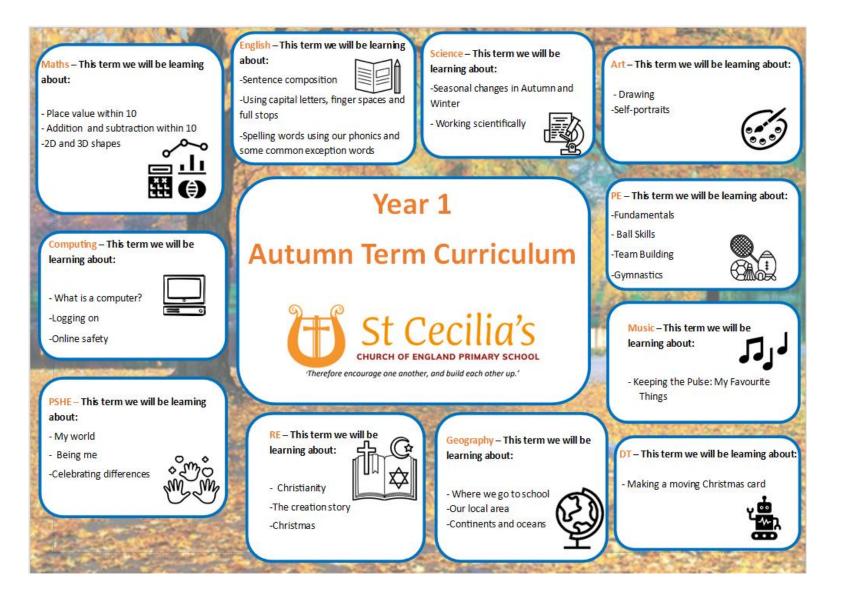
- ➤ Monday

Reading

- It is expected that children will read 3/4 times a week at home but it is suggested that this is done every day.
- When reading with your child, focus purely on fluency.
- Please do not use the reading record as a communication book as I won't always see them, the books are changed by the children's phonics teachers.
- Research has shown that children who read every day make better progress academically.
- > We will also be sending home phonics videos again in the near future.



Suggested Home Learning

Writing 🙆

- •Write for a purpose. Help them write a short shopping list, a thank-you note, or a postcard to a family member.
- •Practice their name. Encourage them to write their name and other simple words. You can use chalk on the pavement or a stick in the mud for a fun alternative to pen and paper.
- •Create a story together. You can draw pictures and then write a simple sentence or two about each one.

Children benefit from:

- A good night's sleep (including an early enough bedtime)
- A healthy diet including a good breakfast
- > Being clean and comfortable
- > Being in school on time

Maths +

- •Count and sort household items. Use toys, socks, or pieces of fruit to practice counting and sorting by colour, size, or type.
- •Involve them in cooking. Let them count out ingredients, measure things, and talk about numbers and amounts.
- •Play counting games. Board games like Snakes and Ladders are great for number recognition and counting forward.

Reading

- Read together every day.
- Discuss the story. Ask them questions like, "What do you think will happen next?" or "Why did the character do that?"
- •Look for words everywhere. Point out words on street signs, food packaging, and television.
- •Read the library book. Library days will be MONDAY.

- If your child has any medical conditions or allergies, please make sure our records (and their medications) are up-to-date. Check this with the office.
- Any medications need to be taken to the office and a form filled out in order for us to administer it.
- Children should not bring in any lip balms, hand gels or hand creams/sprays unless they have been approved by the office.

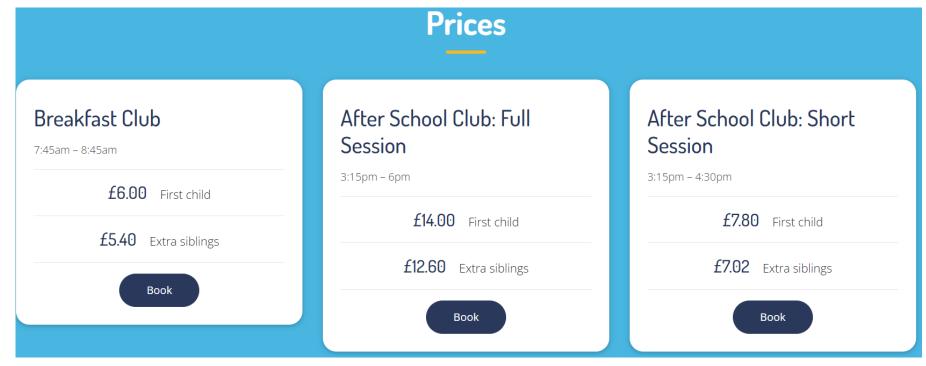
