At St Cecilia's our vision is to be a school community where we celebrate everyone's gifts, and where everyone has a chance to flourish and grow together.









Spelling

▶ Whilst there are 108 words for children to learn to spell on the Y3/4 spelling list, in school we will focus on the rules, not the individual words.

► This enables pupils to apply these rules when spelling a range of words, e.g. -able/-ible - If the root word can stand alone, it is probably -able: collectable. If it can't, it is probably -ible: edible

The next slides are spelling words which children need to know by the end of year. These can be practiced at home but the idea is they apply these spellings to their writing.

Reading

- It is expected that children will read 3/4 times a week at home but it is suggested that this is done every day.
- When reading with your child, focus purely on fluency. A fluency checklist will be in your child's reading record
- ► When children have completed their book (Myon), they will complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader at school.
- https://global-zone61.renaissance-go.com/welcomeportal/2203736
- Accelerated Reader quizzes will check comprehension/understanding.
- Children will need to write their score in their reading record.
- ▶ If a child scores really low on a quiz, we may ask them to re-read the book.
- ▶ Please do not use the reading record as a communication book.
- Research has shown that children who read every day make better progress academically.



<u>Maths</u>

- Children should continue to practise Times Tables and the related division facts
- Children will weekly have a test in school based on all the number facts.
- Children can practise Times Tables in any way that they would like including TTR
- Children should have their log in details stuck in the reading Record

Attendance

- We monitor closely all absences from school and ask our parents/carers to, when possible, to make medical and other appointments outside school hours.
- When a child is absent from school due to sickness, we expect that the school is informed before 9.30am via the school office. This allows us to be sure that we know where all the children are and do not need to spend time chasing parents/carers.
- Please read the parental attendance summary

96%-100% attendance	Your child has the best chance of success!
90-95% attendance	Your child has missed at least 2 weeks of learning
85%-89% attendance	Your child has missed at least 4 weeks of learning
80%-84% attendance	Your child has missed at least 5 1/2 weeks of learning
Below 80% attendance	Your child has missed at least 7 weeks of learning

<u>Lateness</u>

- Lateness also contributes to lost learning e.g. if your child is late 5 minutes each day they lose 3 days!
- Uncomfortable for children to arrive late as everyone watches them

<u>Attendance</u>

We review attendance at the school on a monthly basis

Children who have attendance under between 90% - 95% will receive letter informing parents of the attendance

If attendance does not improve then we will request meetings with parents

Term time Holiday

- Any request for term time off must be made in writing to the Head of School
- Only exceptional circumstances are considered e.g Funerals, Weddings, where dates are out of the family's control
- We can ask for evidence of the exceptional circumstance
- The biggest question we ask is, "Could the time off be avoided?"
- Term time holiday will be marked as unauthorised
- If children have more than 5 days off which is unauthorised, then is it likely that it will result in a fine.
- If fines are not paid then this can lead to prosecution

School Lunches and Breaktime snacks

Children are encouraged to have a break time snack but this snack must be a healthy snack. Below are list of options for a healthy snack:

- A portion of fruit or vegetables
- Bread sticks/ pitta
- Portion of cheese
- Pretzels
- Malt bread

The following are not allowed in school as snacks:

- Crisps
- Chocolate
- Biscuits

These will be confiscated and returned to the children at the end of the day.

Lunches

Option 1 – Packed lunch: Should include a savoury item e.g sandwich, pitta, wrap.
Piece of fruit, biscuit/ crisps and one 'desert'. This should not be a chocolate bar or sweets.


Option 2 – Order a lunch: This can be ordered online in the morning via Arbor. The menu is on the school website.

Children are expected to wear the following items on a day to day basis:





Parent governor


- ➤ We are looking for parent governors...
