At St Cecilia's our vision is to be a school community where we celebrate everyone's gifts, and where everyone has a chance to flourish and grow together.














Behaviour


We focus on positive behaviour and promote kindness at all times

If needed children complete reflection time sheets if behaviour becomes persistent

Attendance

- The Government continue to place high priority on attendance.
- When a child is absent from school due to sickness, we expect that the school is informed before 9.15am via the school office.
- This allows us to be sure that we know where all the children are and do not need to spend time trying to contact parents/carers.
- If attendance drop below 95%, or we identify a pattern in absences, you will be contacted to discuss this.
- If attendance becomes an issue we will work collaboratively with you to improve it.
- As a school we can request medical evidence of illnesses if attendance drops too low.
- Lateness also contributes to lost learning e.g. if your child is late 5 minutes each day they lose 3 days!



<u>Attendance</u>

Term time Holiday

- Any request for term time off must be made in writing to the Head of School
- Only exceptional circumstances are considered e.g Funerals, Weddings, where dates are out of the family's control
- We can ask for evidence of the exceptional circumstance
- The biggest question we ask is, "Could the time off be avoided?"
- Term time holiday will be marked as unauthorised
- If we suspect that a child has been on holiday and the school has not been notified, we will ask for medical evidence of illness as a child who is off for 4/5 days should be visiting a doctor

Regular term time absence can lead to fixed penalty notices and in extreme cases criminal proceedings. Please see out attendance information on our website.

Visiting Secondary Schools

- Please try and arrange to visit secondary schools in the evenings as lots of visits can be very disruptive to your child's education and their absence record.
- Entrance tests will be recorded as an authorised absence for the time that they are attending the school and travel to and from.



School Lunches and Breaktime snacks

Children are encouraged to have a break time snack but this snack must be a healthy snack. Below are list of options for a healthy snack:

The following are not allowed in school as snacks:

These will be confiscated and returned to the children at the end of the day.

Lunches


Option 1 – Packed lunch: Should include a savoury item e.g sandwich, pitta, wrap.

Children are expected to wear the following items on a day to day basis:





Expectations in Year 6

- Demonstrate good behavior and follow school values
- Children are expected to help and set an example to younger members of the school
- Talk to visitors and maybe take people on tours

- Volunteers to help with Nursery and Reception children at lunchtime or with activities
- Help with the smooth running of the school playground equipment, corridor monitors, collective worship and bench monitors
- Become more independent and responsible for belongings and behaviours
- Prepare for transition to secondary school

Spelling

▶ Whilst there are 103 words for children to learn to spell on the Y5/6 spelling list, in school we will focus on the rules, not the individual words.

► This enables pupils to apply these rules when spelling a range of words, e.g. -able/-ible - If the root word can stand alone, it is probably -able: collectable. If it can't, it is probably -ible: edible

The next slides are spelling words which children need to know by the end of year. These can be practiced at home but the idea is they apply these spellings to their writing.

Reading

- It is expected that children will read 3/4 times a week at home but it is suggested that this is done every day.
- When reading with your child, focus purely on fluency. A fluency checklist will be in your child's reading record
- When children have completed their book, they will complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader at school.
- https://global-zone61.renaissance-go.com/welcomeportal/2203736
- Accelerated Reader quizzes will check comprehension/understanding.
- Children will need to write their score in their reading record.
- ▶ If a child achieves a low score on a quiz, we may ask them to re-read the book.
- Please do not use the reading record as a communication book.
- Research has shown that children who read every day make better progress academically.



<u>Maths</u>

- Children should continue to practise Times Tables and the related division facts
- Children will have a weekly test in school based on all the number facts.
- Children can practise Times Tables in any way that they would like including TTR
- Children should have their log in details stuck in the reading Record
